

**TODAY IS WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY** – World Communion Sunday was established in the mid-1930's and has grown into an international ecumenical celebration of Christian unity. It is a day when we mark the almost universal Christian practice of breaking bread with one another and remembering both the night of Jesus' betrayal (when Jesus instituted what we now call the Lord's Supper as a lasting remembrance) and of Jesus' sacrifice. World Communion Sunday is a time for remembering that around the globe – in different languages, with different traditions and customs, and in various forms of liturgy – the Lord's Supper is celebrated throughout Christendom.
