

### YOUTH

"Guide me on your truth and teach me, for you ar God my savior, and my hope is in you all day long" Psalm 25:5



I remember as a youth growing up in church the number of times that I can recall a vital scripture passage or a title from the pastor's message. I think back, and wonder was I even present for the service. My parents reassured me that I was there. What I remember was the time spent in Sunday School, Youth Choir, Young Adult retreats, and Lock-ins. I remember these experiences as if they happened yesterday. I remember the friends that I made: David, Monica, CJ, Trey, Catrina, Dawn, Hardy, and Kelvin. These names spark a host of memories and bring an immediate smile to my face as I gently reflect upon the time that we spent together. From these experiences, I remember bible jeopardy questions, bible challenges, and favorite scriptures. In this, I realize that as a youth, the essential things that I remember about this time were not specifically scriptures and sermon titles but transformative experiences that I had with all of these people. People who I struggled with in understanding life, young adulthood, and, most importantly, God! I remember the great times that we had at church before and after choir rehearsal and think fondly on the songs that we sang. These are the same songs that will randomly work their way to the surface of my mind when going through difficult times. I remember the pillow fights and bible study sessions that were had during lock-ins and retreats. Still, most of all, I remember the struggles to hear God more clearly and to pray with a fellow young adult as they dealt with a traumatic life-altering event as they contemplated suicide.

All of these things and so many more are why we offer Youth and Young Adult programming to our youth. Just as the seasons are changing, the world is also changing. Maybe not in the grand scheme of things. Ecclesiastes (paraphrased) tells us, "there is nothing new under the sun," while this holds true, it may be the first time in our lifetimes that we have dealt publicly with the issues that our youth are working through today. That is why our village is so important. We are a constant resource for our Youth and Young Adults, and they are an important resource for us. Keeping us from "falling back" (daylight saving time November 3<sup>rd</sup>) into old and archaic ways of thinking, always challenging us to face and see things through a new lens. Our youth keep us grounded, energized, and, most importantly, sober in our commitment to our future church and the transformative development thereof. So, take note when you see things like the November 3<sup>rd</sup> Village Service project at the Paris Foundation, November 9<sup>th</sup> Service project @Elkton UMC (Spaghetti Dinner), or November 22<sup>nd</sup> Fundraiser (pancake breakfast). There are opportunities to build relationships and faith as we are genuinely working out our own methods of servicing our community while learning to live God's Love!



### A few reminders for those who use the nursery:

- The nursery is for birth through kindergarten. If your child is in 1<sup>st</sup> grade or higher, they should be in the service.
- Please make sure to sign your children in and leave contact information each week! If there is an emergency, we will need the information.
- If your child is running a fever, has vomited, or had loose bowels in the last 24 hours, please keep them with you or at home. We want to limit the spread of germs!
- Unless you are the volunteer for that service, please limit your time in the nursery. Having parents stay through parts of the service upsets other children whose parents are in the service. (They think it is time to go if other adults are in the room!)

### FINANCE NEWS

The year-to-date balance in the Ministries Fund as of September 30, 2019 is a deficit of \$10,605.60. The total income through September 30<sup>th</sup> was \$310,361.71 and total expenses \$329,967.31.

The church offers electronic or online giving, which allows you to make donations on a scheduled, automatic basis. You can set up your donation to come from your checking or savings account on whatever cycle you choose from the list that is offered. In order to do this, go to the church website (elktonumc.org) and click on Online Donations.

When there is a need to bring cash to the office, please have it counted so that in the process of depositing the cash the amount can be verified. This request is so there is no mistake with a deposit.

When requesting a reimbursement, please complete a yellow Request for Payment form. On the form please indicate what the request is for, attach receipts, and sign it. The forms can be found on the wall next to the nurse's office or the elevator.

#### IT'S TIME TO MAKE YOUR FINANCIAL PLEDGE FOR 2020!

On Sunday, November 17<sup>th</sup>, you'll have the opportunity to make your financial pledge to Christ through our church for 2020. Early in November, you'll be receiving a letter from Joe Buckley, Finance Chairperson, and Pastor Karen, and with that letter will come your pledge card and envelope. We invite you to pray about what you'll give, then fill out the card, and bring it with you to worship on November 17<sup>th</sup>, where you'll be invited to lay it at the altar during the service. You'll be reminded in that letter that our church budget has three parts – ministries, missions and building fund. The ministries budget goes toward all the costs of the church's ongoing ministries, such as curriculum for our education programs, payment of our utility and building expenses, staff salaries and expenses, and so on. The missions budget goes toward our outreach ministries and mission trips. And the building fund goes toward projects to maintain our buildings (possible future projects include power-washing the steeple, replacing the sanctuary air conditioning system, replacing the outdoor shed, addressing roofing issues, etc.). While all three portions of the budget are important, please remember that the ministries budget includes things that are vital to the day-to-day operation of our church.


### WEDNESDAY NIGHT COMMUNION


### THANKSGIVING GIFT CARDS


