Do you know the great work the Missions Committee has been up to? As one of the newest members of the EUMC Missions Committee, I was amazed at how the group stretches our missions' funds to touch so many people in our community and far away. I thought I would highlight some of my favorites in the next few newsletters.

#### **Shoes That Fit**

One mission close to home is Shoes That Fit, and it's particularly touching. We partner with Thomson Estates Elementary School (the same school where we provide mentors). Teachers refer children who need new shoes but may not be able to afford them to the school nurse. The nurse measures their feet and contacts Nancy Mitchell. Nancy has purchased new shoes for over 25 children (and sometimes new coats, if needed). The children are so excited about their new shoes. Listening to Nancy describe the kids' reactions, it is clear that in a small way these new shoes provide dignity, hope, pride and self-esteem. That's an awful lot of good things in a small box, and I feel this is a wonderful project for our church to be a part of. 
