I hope you had a good summer. Along with the hot weather, the church's finances continue to be hot as well. After completing the July financial statements, I am truly amazed as to how well our church is doing. All are truly doing their part to make Elkton United Methodist Church a great place to be. I know the attendance is down some as it usually is during the summer months, but the good news is that our income continues to exceed our expenses. We had a surplus for the month of July of \$4,064 with a year to date surplus of \$18,721. In addition to these numbers, we were able to pay another \$10,000 to the bank to reduce our loan obligation. To date, we have repaid \$90,000 of our loan.

As we head into the fall season, we will need your continued support to maintain our many programs. It has been great so far, let's keep it up. Elkton United Methodist Church continues to be an exciting place to be.




