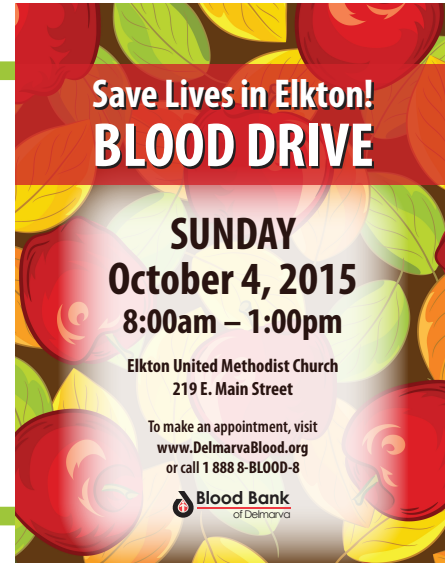


Harvest Food Festival Coming this Month!

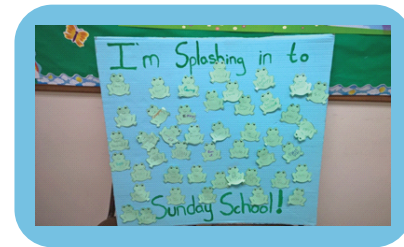


Sunday School News

Finance

As we wind down the summer season and get ready for the new church year, through August we are running a deficit \$38,845. This includes special and abnormal items that do not particularly relate to the regular operations of the church but are items that were either received or paid for.

Our total income is down from last year by \$13,685 but after you take out the special and abnormal items, the income is down \$2,950. This is not too bad since we have just finished the summer time and attendance is not what it is during the other nine months of the year. The shortfall is accounted for by the envelope offering, loose offering, Easter offering, initial offering and Mission offering.

Our expenses are up from last year by \$26,336 but again after you take out the special and abnormal items, our expenses are up \$15,077. The expense increases are from apportionments, postage, staff expenses and youth programs. Other increases are from the Missions program funds that were allocated to new missions such as the Colombia mission, service dog support, purchase of 300 bibles for the Congolese children and South Sudan support. Expense decreases are from building expenses.

The net deficit is up from last year by \$40,021 but after removing special and abnormal items, the deficit is up \$18,027.

The Building Fund has taken in \$54,000 so far this year as we work to secure funds to repay the loans in 2021.

The Finance Committee wants to thank everyone for their continued support of EUMC. I am confident that we will have a great fall and our finances will return to normal and positive results.

As I always say, Elkton United Methodist Church continues to be an exciting place to be and is "A place to know Jesus, be known by Jesus, and make Him known to others." And everyone is important.

We've also noticed that there are several pieces of furniture and equipment being stored in Room 1 (computer desk, desk and drawers, set of 4 ft speakers). If anyone can help us determine where these should be placed, please let Rich or Ted know.

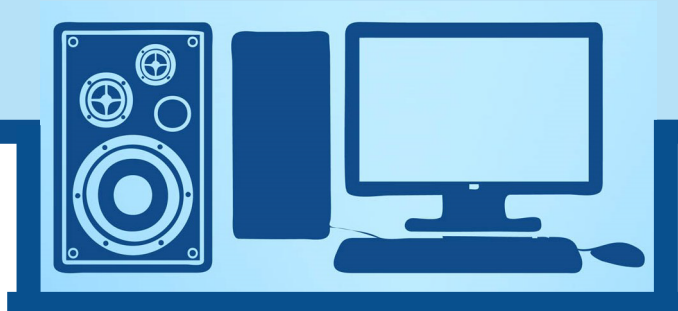
We are looking forward to a calmer season coming up.

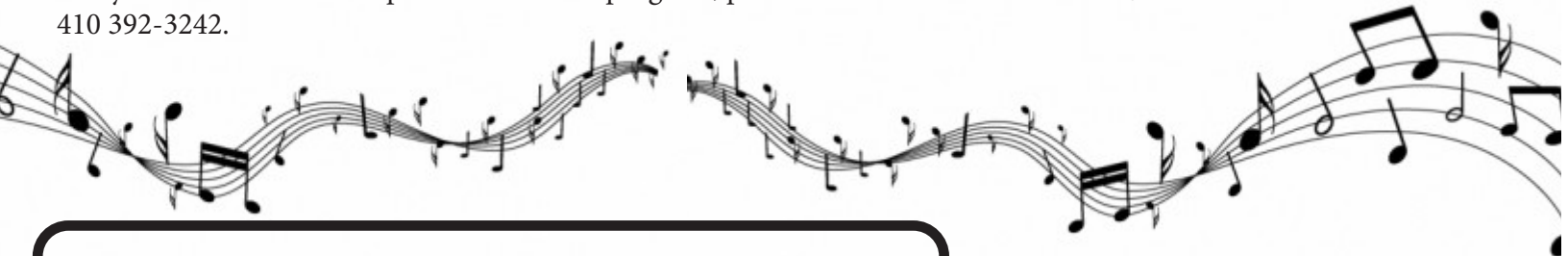
