Finance News

We have just two months to go for the year 2015. Through October for Ministry we are running a deficit of \$59,062. This includes special and abnormal items that contributed to this deficit in the amount of \$40,211. This leaves the deficit for regular operations at \$18,851.

The deviation to last year's results is negative \$53,093. The split is \$19,492 for regular operations and \$33,601 for Special and Abnormal items.

The deviation from last year for regular operations is comprised of Income down \$4,300. Expenses have increased from last year. General expenses are up \$5,400, staff expenses are up \$8,200, Council on Ministry expenses are up \$700 and building and parsonage expenses are up \$900.

The deviation from last year for Special and Abnormal expenses is comprised of the air conditioner replacements, pastor office refurbishment, LED light replacement and Fascia repairs.

The Mission Group has a current year deficit of \$4,350. This deficit is mostly comprised of additional support for Bible purchases for the Congo, Colombia Mission support (paid to Peninsula-Delaware Conference in support of Carlos Reyes-Rodriguez mission trip to Colombia), service dog support and South Sudan Support.

The Building Fund has taken in \$68,000 so far this year as we work to secure funds to repay the loans in 2021.

The Finance Committee wants to thank everyone for their support of EUMC. We do need your continued support in order to meet the financial obligations of our church. With your support we can reduce some of this deficit by the end of the year. We still have a \$14,000 payment due on the Weldin Hall air conditioner replacement.

As I always say, Elkton United Methodist Church continues to be an exciting place to be and is “A place to know Jesus, be known by Jesus, and make Him known to others.” And everyone is important.

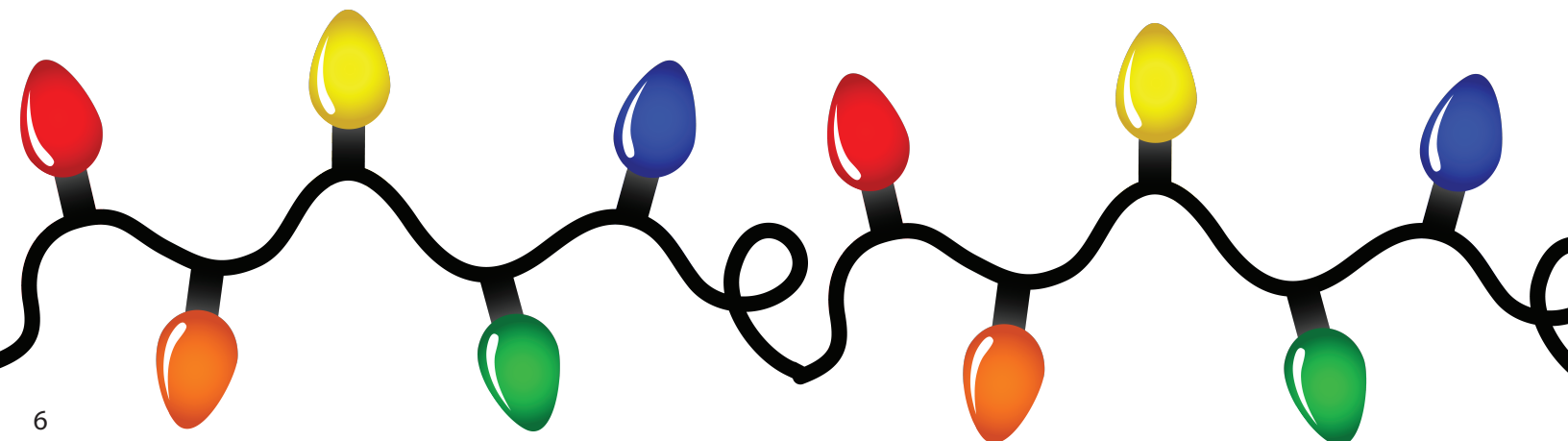

"All About Your Offering"

- a.** Pledges for 2016 – Thanks to all who made their financial pledges for 2016. The results are being tallied, and we'll report them in the Sunday bulletin and January newsletter. Please note that if you haven't had a chance to turn in your pledge card, it's not too late. Simply put it in the offering plate on Sunday. If you didn't get a pledge card, or lost yours, call the church office or email eumcadmin@comcast.net for another one.
- b.** On-Line Giving – The first of the year is a good time to sign up for on-line giving if you haven't already done so. It's really easy and makes giving to the church so convenient. Simply go to the church website, elktonumc.org, and click on "on-line donation" and you'll be walked through the process of setting up your on-line giving. Besides helping you out, it also is a great help to the church when you give on-line because it provides a steady line of income even when weather is bad or people are away – so why not consider signing on today?
- c.** ATTENTION CURRENT ON-LINE GIVERS – Don't forget to go onto the church website (elktonumc.org) and update your pledge amount for 2016. Simply click on "on-line donation" and it will direct you as to how to put in the new amount. If you have any difficulty, call the church office or email eumcadmin@comcast.net.
- d.** End of Year Special Giving – As you probably know, after having had several good years with a budget surplus, this year our church is running a deficit (mostly due to unforeseen expenditures – broken air conditioners, storm damage to the church building, etc.). End of the year special gifts to help offset this deficit would be greatly appreciated.
- e.** Offering Envelopes for 2016 – During the last couple of weeks of December, next year's offering envelopes will be available for you to pick up. They will be laid out in alphabetical order on tables near the Welcome Center. If you use envelopes, it helps greatly for you to pick them up, rather than the church having to send them through the mail. If you cannot find your envelopes, or if you haven't had envelopes in the past, but would like them for 2016, please call the church office.
