

It's that time again! Time to produce a new, updated pictorial directory of our church members.

The process begins with members signing up to have their picture taken at a table the Hospitality area after the 8:30am and 11:00am services on Sundays, April 3, 10, and 17. Volunteers will be on hand to assist you and to distribute literature provided by Lifetouch Pictorial Directories (formerly Olan Mills) detailing the various configurations and prices of available picture packages they offer. Having that information prior to your photo shoot will cut back on the amount of time you spend ordering pictures after your sitting so things will move along quicker. At the time of booking your appointment, you will have to state how many people will be in the picture and if you are including a pet(s). This will make it easier for the photographer to set up and have everything ready for you when it's your turn. You will also need to check your address, telephone and email information for the directory at the time of your sitting so updates can be made.

The photo sittings will be scheduled on Wednesday, April 27, Thursday, April 28, Friday, April 29 and Saturday, April 30. The weekday appointments will run from 2:00pm until 9:00pm; Saturday appointments will be scheduled from 10am until 5:00pm. We ask that you please schedule your sitting earlier on the weekdays to keep Saturday and evening hours open to families and college students. Plan to be at the church for approximately one hour the day of your sitting. Please, come prepared and come at least 15 minutes early, so you don't hold up the appointments after you.

You should have your new directory sometime in August.


