Missions News

We have been unable to come up with a date for our spring blood drive that can work for both EUMC and the Blood Bank of Delmarva. The Blood Bank had to cancel our May 7th date because they did not have staff available. We were looking at dates into July for mutually acceptable dates so we decided to cancel the spring blood drive. We have proposed Sunday, October 15th for a fall blood drive but we are still waiting for confirmation.

On May 6th, Judy Tanner and Grace Starrett helped to open and clean the EUMC cabin at Camp Pecometh. They dusted and swept the cabin and scrubbed the 12 mattresses on the six bunk beds in our cabin. On May 9th, Phil Czarnecki and Sonny Tenney pressure washed the front porch, repaired seriously damaged screens, replaced the badly worn and damaged screen door, patched carpenter bee holes, and stained the front porch, screens, and some of the repaired sides of the cabin. In addition, we replaced the screen door of an adjacent cabin that had been partially blown off. The transformation of our cabin was remarkable.

Coming up later in the year are three travel missions that are in the planning stages. Our annual trip to Kentucky is scheduled for July 8th-16th and preparations are in the works as in the past. We are considering a possible mission trip to southern West Virginia in the fall to help repair damage done by flooding in the summer of 2016. The mission trip to Costa Rica in early August is coming together. We currently have a team of six people with the possibility of adding several more. The Nino's dinner fundraiser was a success and, we will be conducting a number of other fundraisers to help provide financial support and hope we can count on your support.

Year to date at the end of April, Missions income was \$16,555 which was \$828 more than last year.

Mission expenses year to date at the end of April were \$14,726 which were \$3086 less than last year.


