There are several Missions already scheduled for 2017. EUMC will again be hosting the Homeless Shelter from March 6th through March 12th. We have supported this mission faithfully in the past and with your help will do so again in March. In talking to those who are homeless, there are many reasons why their lives have turned out the way they have - bad circumstances and sometimes bad decisions. For instance, a bad decision based on bad circumstances by a 17 year old ends up 25 years later with a 42 year old homeless person. But they are our brothers and sisters in need of our help.

We will again put together a walking team for the Delaware Brain Tumor Walk on April 22nd. Please consider becoming a member of the team or help by supporting a walker. Our walk is dedicated to our loved ones who have suffered from this terrible affliction; so if you have a loved one you would like to dedicate our walk to, please let us know. All proceeds go to support research to help end this affliction.

On April 23rd we will again have a blood drive in Weldin Hall. We have supported this mission very actively in the past with donations of 30 to 40 units of blood in each of the three previous blood drives. We are hoping to exceed this level of giving in this drive in April.

These are just small samplings of how those of us at EUMC can serve our Lord by helping our neighbors. I am looking forward to a New Year of support for those in need!

Year to date at the end of Nov. Missions income was \$45,044 which was \$424 more than 2015. Mission expenses year to date at the end of Nov. were \$37,677 which were \$7035 less than 2015.

#### **Finance News**

Bill Ferringer, Chairman

The ongoing operations of the church through November is positive \$1,831.

Income is up from last year by \$5,792. The main components are offering income is up from last year by \$994, Youth program income is up \$1,805 and rental income is up \$3,018. All other income is down \$25.

General expenses are down from last year by \$92. Apportionment and district office expenses are up \$3,640. Office supplies, postage and other expenses are down \$3,732.

Pastor and staff expenses are down \$2,084.

Council on Ministries expense is up from last year \$3,044. Ministries Program and Evangelism are up \$3,393. Youth and Education are down \$260 and all other expenses down \$89.

Building expenses are down from last year by \$3,579. Church utilities are down \$2,951 and copier expenses are down \$1,111 due to the lease of new copiers at a lower price and the first month rental being paid by the vendor. Church repairs and maintenance are up \$483.

Parsonage expenses are up from last year by \$1,126. This is primarily due to repairs and maintenance.

Non-Operation is a net deficit of \$13,128. This is primarily due to the second payment for the Weldin Hall air conditioner replacement of \$14,000.

The Building Fund received \$67,289 this year as we work to secure funds to repay the loans of \$245,000 in 2021. Total balance on hand is \$125,588.

The Finance committee continues to ask everyone to be good stewards and keep your pledges up to date.

As I always say, Elkton United Methodist Church continues to be an exciting place to be and is "A place to know Jesus, be known by Jesus, and make Him known to others." And everyone is important.






