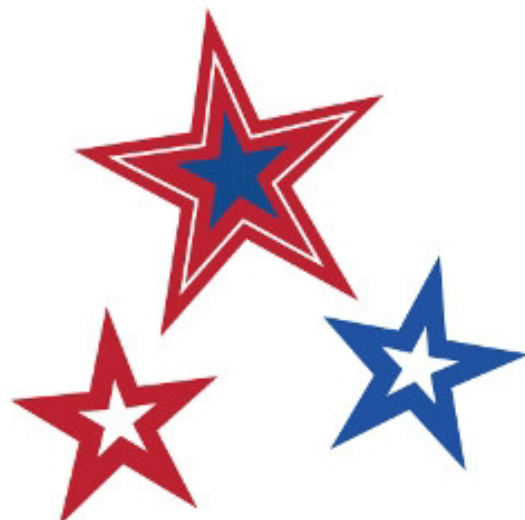

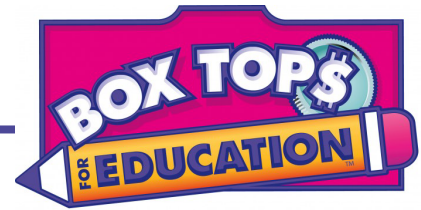

Congratulations to our graduates and their families and to our newest church members: Paige Barnard, Andrew Kosinski, Halle O'Neal and David Pugh.

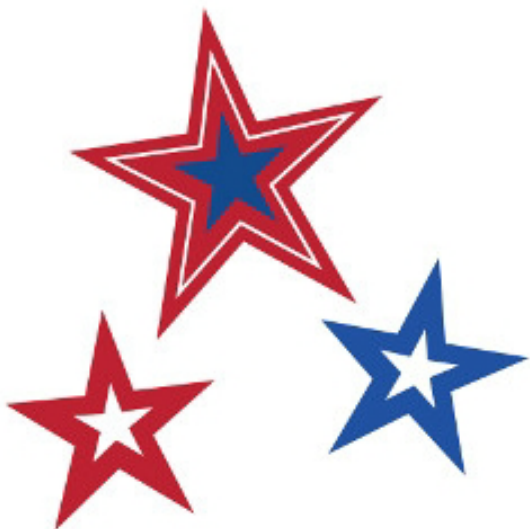

Finance News

The financial position of EUMC through May is positive \$7,985.

Income through May was \$180,375. Offering income was \$168,539. Rental Income was \$8,005. Youth income was \$1,579. Other Income totaled \$2,252.

Total expenses through May were \$172,390. The major components of the expenses are:

1. Apportionments and District Office - \$22,035
2. Pastor and Associate Pastor Expenses - \$45,935
3. Staff Expenses - \$56,104
4. Council on Ministry expenses - \$12,113
5. Utilities – \$10,183
6. Insurance – \$4,697
7. Building Expenses - \$10,886
8. Parsonage Expenses - \$2,889
9. General and office expenses - \$7,548

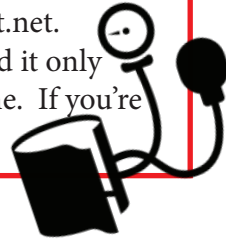
The Building Fund received \$32,303. Total balance on hand is \$156,192. We need a total of \$235,000 to repay the loans.

The organ fund has a current balance of \$35,169. The third and final payment of \$34,832 on the organ is due mid-June. There are still some minor expenses to be incurred but overall, the fund will just be about break even. This has been a huge undertaking to purchase a \$105,000 organ and have it installed. Thank you's go to everyone who helped support this project.

From a financial stand point, EUMC is off to a good start. The Finance Committee as always thanks everyone for their support. It makes our job a whole lot easier.

As I always say, Elkton United Methodist Church continues to be an exciting place to be and is “A place to know Jesus, be known by Jesus, and make Him known to others.” And everyone is important.

Every second Sunday of the month, we have a team of dedicated people who give their time and perform blood pressure screenings in our Parish Nurse office after each worship service. We are looking to add to that team! If you have the skills and knowledge and would like to help with blood pressure checks 2-3 times a year, please call the church office at 410-398-0933 or email Kay at eumcadmin@comcast.net. We need help after each service and it only takes about 30 minutes of your time. If you're interested, let us know!!
