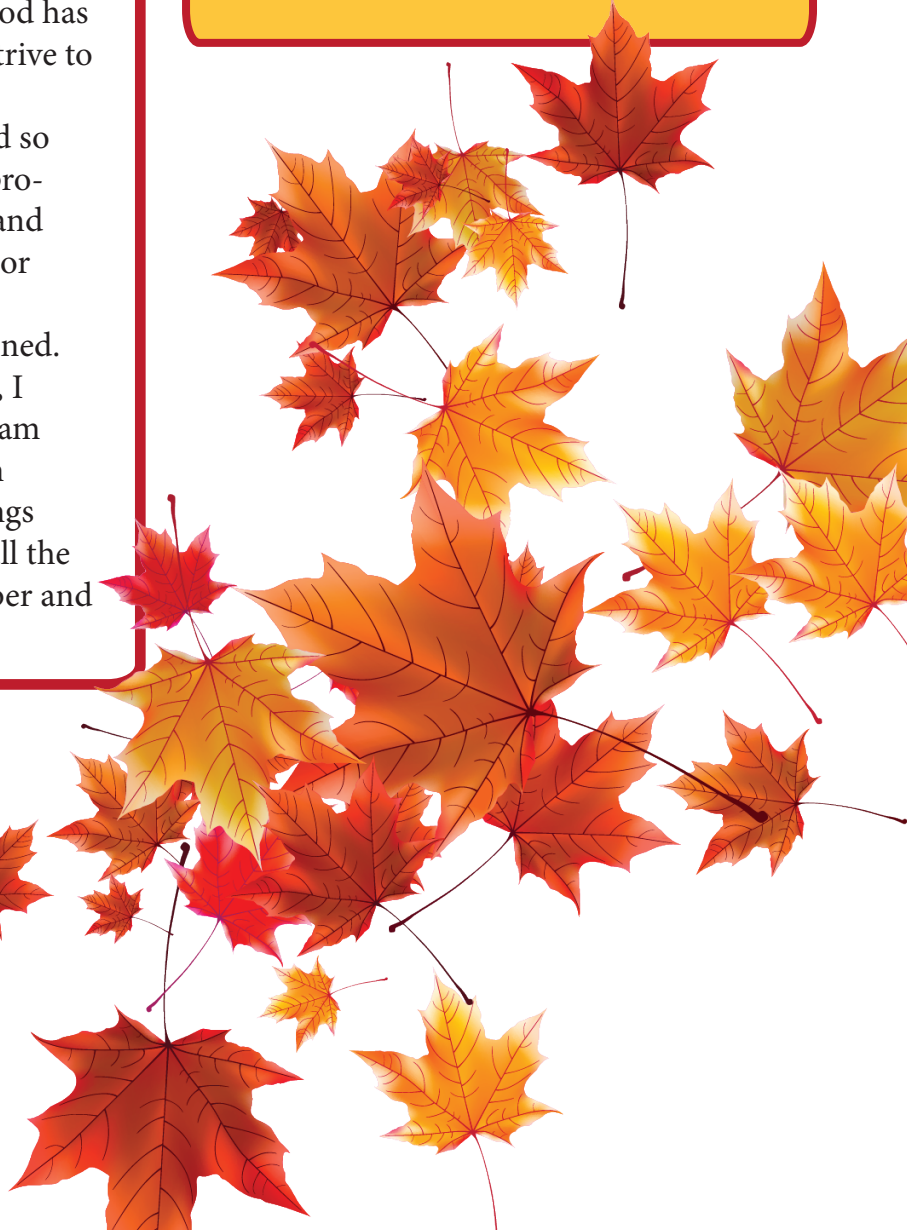

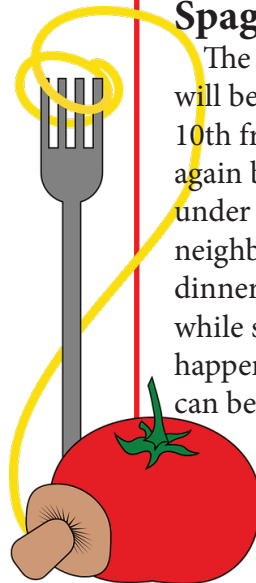

Sunday School and Education News

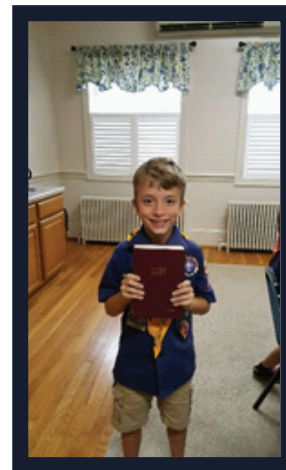

It's Time to Make Your Financial Pledge for 2019!

On Sunday, November 18th, you'll have the opportunity to make your financial pledge to Christ through our church for 2019. Earlier in November, you'll be receiving a letter from Linda White, Finance Committee Vice-Chair and Pastor Karen, and with that letter will come your pledge card and envelope. We invite you to pray about what you'll give, then fill out the card, and bring it with you to worship on November 18th, where you'll be invited to lay it at the altar during the service. You'll be reminded in that letter that our church budget has three parts – ministries, missions and building fund. The ministries budget goes toward all the costs of the church's ongoing ministries, such as curriculum for our education programs, payment of our utility and building expenses, staff salaries and expenses, and so on. The missions budget goes toward our outreach ministries and mission trips. And the building fund goes toward projects to maintain our buildings (possible future projects include power-washing the steeple, replacing the sanctuary air conditioning system, replacing the outdoor shed, addressing roofing issues, etc.). While all three portions of the budget are important, please remember that the ministries budget includes things that are vital to the day-to-day operation of our church.

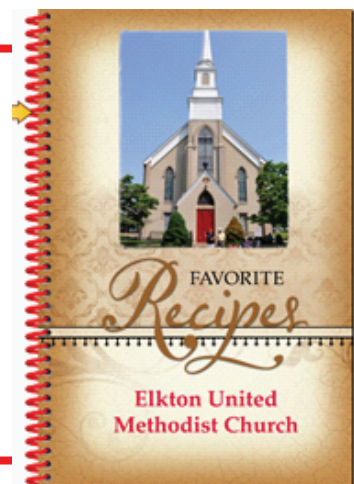
