
So at this time of year when God gave us something special, the members of this committee wish to give you and your families all the best.

Words of Hope from E. Stanley Jones

"The widespread breakdown in individual and collective life is due to a loss of confidence. We are not sure that what is happening has cosmic backing and support. Something has snapped and left life dangling at loose ends. The Christian life, which has been the cement that has held civilization together, has broken down in many minds; hence, life is left without guidance, because it is without goal. When God goes, goal goes. Life turns dead on our hands. The story is told that Schopenhauer, the philosopher and apostle of pessimism, sat slumped on a park bench, deep in thought. A policeman, mistaking him for a tramp, said to him, "Who are you? And what are you here for?" Schopenhauer slowly replied, "I wish I knew." He held no key in his hand to unlock the meaning of life, and the uncertainty made him a pessimist. Amid all this gloom and uncertainty, there is one bright spot— the Christian way. Here life lights up. It regains a sparkle, takes on meaning, goal. Here there seems to be promise of a way out. Our faith in Jesus Christ must be everything or nothing. It must control the whole of life or none of it. It must not merely be a way; it must be the Way. And it must be the Way for everything and everybody, everywhere and in every circumstance. Life must become a single piece, a whole. It must have total meaning. Unless it has total meaning, it becomes a total mess." (Selected Text) Jones, E. Stanley, "The Way" Abingdon Press.

Acts 9:2 and asked letters from him to the synagogues of Damascus, so that if he found any who were of the Way\*, whether men or women, he might bring them bound to Jerusalem.

#### **Finance News**

It is with a very heavy heart that I am writing for the News Letter in place of Bill Ferringer.

The financial position of EUMC through October is negative (\$59,884.00), this amount is the actual verses the budget.

The 2018 Budget includes \$35,000 for new air conditioning for the sanctuary, which thankfully we did not need, so the adjusted negative amount is (\$24,884.)

The total Income through October is \$365,122. The Expenses through October \$384,953.which is a \$19,831. Negative.

The Building Fund was able to pay off the loans for Wesley Wing three years early – this is something to celebrate.

#### **Expense Components through October:**

- Apportionments and District Office \$45,968.
- Pastor and Associate Pastor Expenses -\$100,633.
- Staff Expenses \$127,351.
- Council on Ministry expenses \$16,211.
- Utilities \$17.810.
- Insurance -\$8,959.
- Copier Expenses \$9,466.
- Property Taxes (Rental Property) \$2,518.
- Other Building Expenses \$29,728. (This includes Parking Lot Seal/Stripe and Church Security Update.)
- Parsonage Expenses \$11,474.

# An Invitation to Persons 70 and Over from the Finance Committee

The end of the year is coming and you (if you are 70 ½) have a unique opportunity to make a gift to the church. If you are 70 ½ or older, have an IRA, and are subject to required minimum distribution (RMD), gifting some or all of your RMD using the qualified charitable distribution strategy may be a great way to both benefit the church and reduce the taxes you pay.

A qualified charitable distribution is not included in your adjusted gross income, therefore it is not taxable.

You cannot take active receipt of the money. You can give it directly to the church with the necessary documentation. You request the payee to make the check out to the church, send it to you, and then you can forward it to the church.

Talk to your financial advisor and your tax advisor to learn more about qualified charitable distributions. Pray about and consider making that year-end gift to Elkton UMC!




