Help Fill our Next Round of College Care Packages



Finance

The financial position of EUMC for the year 2017 is negative (\$4,698). Even though the year finished negative we had started the year with a budget negative of (\$19,700). We improved on this by \$15,002 with slightly higher income and holding down expenses.

Income is up from the budget by \$1,852. Expenses were down from the budget by \$13,150.

Income for the year was up from the budget by \$1,852 as shown below:

- 1. Offering Income (\$2,525)
- 2. Rental Income \$175
- 3. Youth Income \$1,579 (Mainly reimbursement for Youth trips)
- 4. Interest & Dividend Income \$908
- 5. Miscellaneous Income \$1,715

Expenses were down from the budget by \$13,150 as shown below:

- 1. General Expenses \$1,161
- 2. Pastor and Associate Pastor Expenses \$585
- 3. Staff Expenses \$2,647
- 4. Ministry Program \$3,002
- 5. Education Program \$1,809
- 6. Other Council on Ministry Expenses \$2,327
- 7. Air Conditioner for Office (\$2,300)
- 8. Utilities \$2,450
- 9. Insurance \$191
- 10. Fire Security System (\$505)
- 11. Building Maintenance (\$112)
- 12. All other Building Expenses (\$619)
- 13. Parsonage Expenses \$2,514

The Building Fund received \$77,831 in contributions and paid out \$9,400 in interest on the loans. Total balance on hand at the end of the year is \$192,322. The loan balance is \$235,000.

Other support from our church members include the purchase and payment of \$106,500 new organ.

And, the support we received for Hurricane relief was just overwhelming. We received over \$16,000 for this relief effort. Thank you so much for your support in 2017.

As I always say, Elkton United Methodist Church continues to be an exciting place to be and is "A place to know Jesus, be known by Jesus, and make Him known to others." And everyone is important.

2017 EUMC Cookbook Sales




