The 2018 Delaware Brain Tumor 5k Walk/Run was held on a beautiful April 21st. EUMC participated with 17 walkers and 1 runner raising \$1,572 for the cause. Of the 87 teams participating, EUMC came in at 29th in donations raised. Not too shabby, heh?

Our next committee meeting will be held in early June and more information on our next activities will be forthcoming. For example, further updates on our Kentucky and Costa Rica mission trips; information regarding my recent visit to the Cecil County Pregnancy center and how we may be able to support this worthwhile and local organization; our efforts in expanding the mentoring program (currently involved with Thomason Estates) to Holly Hall which has expressed interest in our support; and our support for the Community Kitchen which is held at Elkton Presbyterian Church where we will have a new church member joining their Board of Directors as well as a luncheon coordinator.

## Finance News

The financial position of EUMC for the period through April 2018 is positive \$13,052.

Income is up from the budget by \$5,856. Expenses are down from the budget by \$7,774.

Income for the period was up from the budget by \$5,856 as shown below:

1. Offering Income – \$6,039
2. Rental Income – (\$951)
3. Youth Income - \$315
4. Miscellaneous Income - \$453

Expenses were down from the budget by \$7,774 as shown below:

1. General Expenses - \$333
2. Pastor and Associate Pastor Expenses - \$2,599
3. Staff Expenses - \$4,139
4. Ministry Program - \$760
5. Education Program - \$1,981
6. Utilities – (\$2,716)
7. Insurance – (\$1,459)
8. Building Maintenance – \$1,563
9. All other Building Expenses – \$426
10. Parsonage Expenses - \$148

The Building Fund received \$22,293 in contributions. Total balance on hand at the end of April is \$214,615. The loan balance is \$235,000. The Finance committee expects to pay off the member loan by the end of the year.

## Trustees Report

Upon the recommendation of the Board of Trustees, the Administrative Council voted to approve the sale of our rental property located at 109 Locust Lane. We are in the process of obtaining an appraisal and then either doing minor repairs, or selling the property “as is.” We will keep you informed as to the progress of this project.

The closet located in Weldin Hall next to the table/chair storage area has been cleaned out and is being modified so we can relocate the kitchen equipment storage area from the basement to this space. That will make it much, much easier for all of the meal events that take place in Weldin Hall.

Repairs to our sanctuary roof are scheduled to be done this month, weather permitting.

Paige Laning will be rehabilitating some of the parking lot islands for her “Gold Award Project” during the month of June. (Please see the article about this elsewhere in this newsletter).

As I write this, the fire alarm and safety systems are scheduled for testing. This includes fire alarms, pull stations, exit lights, emergency lights and sprinkler systems.

Tom White and Henry Fehlman are searching for and organizing church building construction drawings and documents. We are missing all documents for the rebuilding of the sanctuary, etc. If anyone knows where they are located, please let them know.
