From the Pastor

Dear Friends,

I'll never forget when I learned for the first time that some churches don't observe Lent. It was during a conversation I had with my friend Linda, who grew up in a Southern Baptist Church in Texas. Linda's husband, Hugh, was in the Air Force, and over the course of their many moves around the country, they ended up worshipping in churches of many different denominations, and when I first met her, they were worshipping in the United Methodist Church where I was serving as the Student Pastor. She had no idea what Lent was all about (or for that matter, Advent, too. They didn't observe that either.)

Because I've spent my whole life in the United Methodist Church, and have observed those two seasons in the church my whole life, I actually felt sorry for her. And now that we're in the season of Lent, moving toward Easter, I remember how important these seasons are in helping us remember who Jesus is and what he has done for us. Though Lent can be "heavy" and sometimes incredibly sad, yet it serves to help us remember the price he paid for us and our salvation. We hear of the opposition he faced, the threats that were hurled his way, the horrible death he died – and we remember that he did it for us. We walk with him the way of the cross, knowing that he would give his all for us. It is an emotional, tremendously hard journey . . .

But . . . it ends with the victory of Easter! And Easter is all the more sweet each year after we've made this journey through Lent. We celebrate the fact that evil didn't win, that Jesus rose victorious, that he lives!

I'm so glad to be on this journey with you – to struggle together through the painful parts of our story, but even more, to celebrate the greatest news ever on Easter morning! Can't wait!

As you can see, the expenses in February exceeded the amount of income by \$3,647. In the month of February 2018, there was also a deficit and the amount then was \$1,600.

The YTD balance in 2019 versus 2018 is larger. In 2018, the YTD balance was \$3,605 compared to \$10,131 in 2019. The reason for this is in January, the church received several pledges for the year in full.

If You Have A Key To The Church Door - Please Read

It has been brought to our attention that there have been difficulties with locking and unlocking the main door at the rear of the church. Please see below for instructions/hints for locking and unlocking this door.

When Entering: First, check to see if the door is unlocked before inserting your key. **DO NOT** attempt to use your key for an unlocked door, as this will activate the locking mechanism and the key will become stuck.

When Leaving the Building: If the door is unlocked, after pressing the lock/unlock button, wait until the locking mechanism releases the locking bar/panic bar (approx. 15 seconds). If you do not wait for the bar to release and hit the button again, you will override the locking sequence and the door will revert to unlock. If the panic bar does not activate after 15 seconds, push the panic bar forcefully to make sure the locking mechanism is activated and then push the unlock button again and wait. **DO NOT** attempt to lock the door from the outside with your key.

Jammed Door: Should the door become jammed, push the panic bar forcefully to release it.

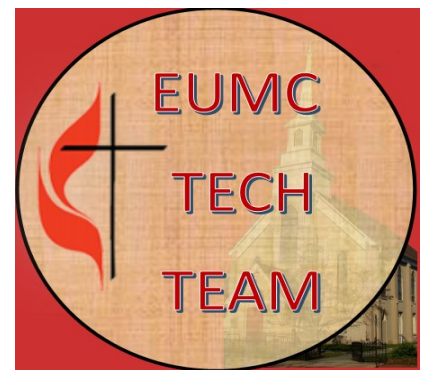
You're Invited to Remember and Give Thanks For Someone Special This Easter

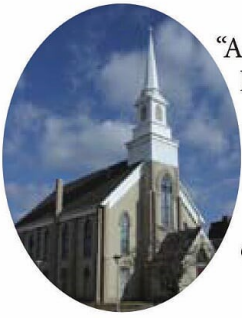
