

A Forum on The Way Forward

Background Information:

At the 1972 General Conference of the United Methodist Church, language was added to the Book of Discipline regarding homosexuality: the practice, the disallowance of ministers to be self-avowed practicing homosexuals, defining the institution of marriage as only between a man and a woman, and disallowing ministers to marry homosexuals. Every General Conference since this topic has been debated and except for a few minor changes to the Book of Discipline it has remained the same. In 2016, the General Conference authorized the Council of Bishops to create a Special Commission of 32 clergy, lay leaders, and members to create a plan to give to the Bishops on The Way Forward (the name given to the decision the church will need to make regarding this topic). On February 23-26, 2019 in St. Louis Missouri a special General Conference will be held to review the plans from the Special Commission and to determine The Way Forward for the United Methodist Church.

Upcoming Event:

Over the past two months, the Church and Society Committee has facilitated two different conversations on The Way Forward. We recognize that there is a lot more discussion and knowledge-sharing that needs to happen around this topic for any member of the church to participate in. On January 27th at 12:30 pm we invite you to *A Forum on The Way Forward*. This will be another opportunity to learn about the three proposed plans from the Council of Bishops that will be presented at the Special General Conference. Also during this Forum there will be an opportunity to break into small groups to discuss the issue and the proposed plans. In order for us to provide you with lunch, we ask that you let us know if you will be attending by putting your name on the sign-up sheet in the Hospitality Area or emailing Susan Starrett at starrett623@yahoo.com.

We ask that you prayerfully consider attending this Forum and that you remain in prayer for the delegates of the special General Conference and for the unity of all of us as United Methodists.



Finance News

The financial position of Elkton UMC through November is negative (\$29,342).

The year-to-date income total is \$397,181 (consists of offering \$374,492, rental income \$13,895, youth \$2,641 and other income \$6,155).

The Building Fund received \$8,888, since paying off the loans for the Wesley Wing.

Thank you for your generous donations. Please pray that the church will close 2018 without a negative balance.

Also, thank you for letting me serve the church.

The expenses total year-to-date is \$426,523, which consists of the following:


