MISSION TEAM UPDATE—Thank you and an Important Reminder Submitted by Mike Foster

- Thanks to all of those who assisted in the preparation and serving of meals for Vacation Bible School.
- By the time this newsletter is published, members will have returned from the Kentucky mission trip.
 We know they had a wonderful and fulfilling experience and look forward to hearing of their experiences.
- Our second mission trip this year will be to Spirit Lake Ministries located in North Dakota. There will be about 10 of us participating, beginning the journey on July 27th and returning on August 2nd. The Spirit Lake Mission team is holding two fundraisers to help support the mission team's trip and the residents of the mission community. We will be selling Stakeholder certificates for \$75. Each Stakeholder will receive two tickets to attend a dinner with the team when we return in the fall. We will also have envelopes with varying dollar amounts on them. We will ask interested parties to take the envelope of their choice and return it with the amount enclosed. Both fundraisers will begin on July 7th. There has been a lot asked of the congregation recently, but we hope you will find a bit more room in that pocket of yours.
- On July 19th, EUMC will be serving the luncheon at the Community Kitchen. See below.
- Recently EUMC and you may have received a mailing from Union Hospital to help support the Cancer Resource Center through donations. Several of our congregants are very involved with this worthwhile endeavor. The CRC provides much needed information, support, supplies, and time to those struggling with this dreaded illness. The Missions Committee approved a \$500 donation and it is hoped that you give this effort your consideration and support. If you wish more information, please see Mike Foster.

Save the Date: July 19th

Sometimes it can be discouraging to hear yet another call for help. A friend of mine recently said to me, "I never hear what happens when I give; I never hear anything. It's just sort of a bottomless pit that seems to soak up everything I give, but I never see any good that it does. I'd just like to know what's going on with the resources. If my giving is making a positive difference, of course I'd like to know that. But if my donated resources are falling short, if there is failure, then I want to know that too. It's the never knowing. It's the never getting any feedback that is disheartening." Well, just in case those comments resonate with you, I'm here to communicate the rest of the story. On Friday, May 24th, while serving as the anchor for Elkton Community Kitchen, I talked with a county representative whose office is there at the church and whose objective is to help the homeless find sustainable shelter and employment. She told me that she came into this job on December 18th last year, and set a personal goal to house and employ ten people or family units in her first year. It is May, and she just placed her eighth family; she said not only do they pick up the keys to the apartment that day, but that the owner offered the husband a part-time job. That, my friends, is a success story. It's actually eight success stories. Every Friday, Elkton Community Kitchen serves lunch to, on average, sixty guests. The government places a fairly low dollar value to this lunch service, but I can tell you that from where I sit in that dining hall, the service that we provide is far

more valuable than this dollar amount. The fact that folks in our community who are striving to meet the bare, basic human needs can count on a nutritious lunch on Friday, can count on a safe and clean place to gather for a couple of hours, can count on a friendly welcome and compassionate smiles, can count on good, wholesome interactions – this is what makes a difference in our community. On Friday, May 24th, 71 people enjoyed a lunch prepared and served by a private individual and his team of volunteers, one of whom is a pastor from India, here in America for a short time. This pastor volunteered to offer our opening prayer and the passion with which he praised God for our many blessings created a chorus of Amens across the dining hall. And then, a child of about 5 years old offered his simple prayer, "God is great, God is good, thank you for this food, Amen," delivered in his strong and confident voice that brought applause from the guests. Yes, there were two guests that appeared to be under the influence, one sleeping on folded arms. I asked his friend if he was ok, and with tears in his eyes, his friend answered that yes, his friend was just tired, but it meant a lot that I asked about him. A few tables over, I was honored that a guest was excited to introduce his younger brother to me, noting to him that "the food's good but the people here are really good." This, my friends, is the other half of the story. This is the feedback that makes donated resources and community service important not only to those who struggle to make ends meet every week, but also to those who are looking to find purpose in their lives. EUMC is a church family who is richly blessed and who richly gives. Sharing God's resources with neighbors in our community creates an opportunity to share life values through wholesome interaction. Won't you consider being part of a team to volunteer as a crew to serve an Elkton Community Kitchen lunch on July 19th?



Creating a Reconciling Community

After the Special General Conference in February and the approval of the Traditional Plan, there were a lot of feelings experienced by many members of the United Methodist Church. Some people were hurt, some felt the right thing was done, others didn't have feelings one way or the other. For those who were hurt by the ruling, they also were (still are) angry, sad, disappointed, frustrated, and more. People who are lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, or questioning (LGBTQ) feel like the United Methodist Church is targeting them directly unlike any other population in recent history.

LGBTQ persons and allies want to do something. We are not ok to just sit and wait for something else to happen. A group of members of EUMC have been meeting together since February, we have participated in meetings with other members of the Peninsula-Delaware Conference to figure out what action can be done now and not just wait for the next General Conference in 2020, and we have become individual members of Reconciling Ministries Network (www.rmnetwork.org). Other churches in the Peninsula-Delaware Conference have become Reconciling Churches (entire congregation) while others have formed Reconciling Communities (a group within the Church). Reconciling Individuals, Communities, and Congregations make a commitment to achieving LGBTQ justice and full inclusion in the life and ministry of the United Methodist Church, both in policy and in practice. They engage in the ministry of Reconciliation in two ways:

- 1. Outreach, welcome, and ministry with and for LGBTQ persons in the local setting.
- 2. Create ongoing opportunities to engage in dialogue, build relationships, and advocate for the necessary changes to the discriminatory statements and policies in our Book of Discipline including those that prohibit same-sex marriage officiated by UM clergy, same-sex marriage ceremonies held in our sanctuaries, and the ordination of gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender persons called to ministry.


