HELP CELEBRATE OUR 220TH ANNIVERSARY & RESTORE OUR BEAUTIFUL STEEPLE!

The beautiful white steeple atop our church is a beacon for our community and most of you have noticed that over the years, its beautiful white color has been darkened by dirt and grime. For several years, the Board of Trustees looked for companies interested in cleaning it and came up empty. They finally found a wonderful company in Philadelphia specializing in steeple work and engaged them to work on our church. Not only will they be clearing off years of dirt and grime, but they'll be sealing some weak spots, doing other supporting work, and finally painting it bright white again. Of course, that does not come without a cost – a pretty big cost - \$28,000!

Though the cost is significant, we are confident our church can handle it, like we've handled so many things in the past (a new organ, gifts to UMCOR, the Wesley Wing). As a matter of fact, we did a little figuring, using the 220 years of our existence in the formula. If 220 members of our church gave \$125 to the project, it would be paid for. Or, if 125 members gave \$220, it would be paid for. Well, you get the idea – if everybody jumps on board with something, we can pay for this project in no time! What a great way to say "Happy 220th Anniversary!" to ourselves and our community.

You'll be hearing more about this in worship on June 2nd and there will be an offering envelope in that Sunday's bulletin. You're invited to pray about making a contribution and then bring that with you to worship on June 9th.



Finance News

As of the end of April 2019, the total Income for Ministries (operating) was \$158,274.01, the total expenses \$152,121.01, leaving a net of \$7,153.00. The income and expenses for the same period in 2018 were \$158.402.71 and \$145,350.87, respectively, leaving a net of \$13,051.84. The differences in the expenses are those that were listed in the May 2019 newsletter and are Joy of Faith weekend, repairs to the back door, rental property expense, copier tax, upstairs bathroom spruce ups, heating issues, sump pump replacement, and heat pump repair at the parsonage.

The cash balances in the funds as of 4/30/19 are:

- 01 Ministries (Operating) \$75,716.04
- 02 Missions \$23,332.51
- 04 Restricted (for activities associated with the church) \$36,022.70
- 06 Memorial \$17,415.70
- 07 Building \$58,623.20
- 08 Flower \$149.24


The church currently has two CD's, one at the Harford Bank earning 2.6% interest in the amount of 58,000.00 for the period of 21 months, maturing in January of 2021, which is for the Ministries fund. The second CD is at Columbia Bank, purchased from funds received from the sale of the house, which is for the Building Fund, in the amount of \$50,000.00, earning 2.35% for the period of 12 months and maturing in January of 2020. With Raymond James, the church has three stocks that totaled, as of the end of April 2019, \$52,813.46. This gives a reserve of approximately \$160,000.00 for a building of this size and age.






