



- Unless you are the volunteer for that service, please limit your time in the nursery. Having parents stay through parts of the service upsets other children whose parents are in the service. (They think it is time to go if other adults are in the room!)

MUSIC MINISTRY

To Applaud or Not To Applaud?

Miriam-Webster defines applause as a "marked commendation" and "approval publicly expressed (as by clapping the hands)." In our American culture, it is "closely tied to entertainment."



I have been thinking about this subject lately, especially when it comes to applause in a worship setting. I have attended church for most of my life, childhood and adulthood, and have regularly attended a variety of

denominations: Dutch Reformed, United Church of Christ, Disciples of Christ, Presbyterian, Methodist, and Episcopal. Applause during worship did not occur in any of my previous worship experiences, so I can say that I was taken by surprise on my first Sunday back in September. To tell the truth, I can admit that the applause after the choir anthem made me feel uncomfortable. But why? When my students perform concerts for school, I welcome applause. When I perform on the stage or in a concert setting, I must admit that I crave it. When my own children performed in a concert or musical, I was the loudest one clapping! But in worship.....thoughts? EXACTLY! Thoughts, reflections, prayers.... All of the activities that our minds participate in during worship. Yes, praise is also an activity during worship, but praise for whom? Is the anthem an act of worship or a performance? I can certainly understand the reaction (applause) a congregation has to a worship experience (choir anthem or solo musical performance), but if they want to show appreciation, why not for the organ prelude, the scripture reading (some of those biblical texts can be challenging to read), and the sermon? Why only the main musical offering? I think one answer comes from the definition in that it is closely tied to entertainment in our culture. That is why it makes me, personally, feel uncomfortable. Is the choir there to entertain? Are the special soloists, the Men's Ensemble and the Handbell Choir there for the purpose of entertaining the congregation? I think we all know the answer to this. We are all there in equal parts to worship, reflect, pray, confess our sins, give thanks, and praise God's Holy Name. Yes, we are also there to support and love one another, but we do that in other aspects of our church life, in Sunday School, in coffee hour, at spaghetti dinners, in youth group, in circle meetings, and in other facets of our spiritual life. On the other hand, I will admit that a word of appreciation for the choir's offering, after the service has concluded, goes a long way to making the director and the other choir members feel appreciated and loved, even though that is not what we are seeking as a response from the congregation. I would like to challenge the congregation to reflect upon what motivates the applause. Is it a job well done, to show appreciation, to praise God, or is it just an impulsive reaction to a musical performance? Could we better show appreciation by saying a quiet "Amen," saying a prayer, or talking directly to the musicians after the service? Let's open up the dialogue about this. I would appreciate any and all feedback from the congregation. Let's talk!

The total in the Mission Fund at the end of October was \$15,287.83.



We had a big project to replace the water coil of the heating unit above the ceiling in Weldin Hall. There were a couple of "indoor rain showers", some cold days and nights, and a couple of cancelled activities, but the water coil has been replaced and the room is nice and cozy once again. Also, a note to anyone looking for the thermostat controlling the second floor Sunday school rooms, it has been moved to the hallway just outside the door to the nursery.







UPDATE ON HAPPENINGS IN THE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

The special session of General Conference that took place earlier this year in St. Louis reaffirmed the current Discipline regarding ordination of self-avowed practicing homosexuals (which is not permitted) and celebration of same gender weddings in United Methodist churches or by United Methodist clergy (which is also not permitted). The only change that came as a result of that conference is regarding penalties for clergy who go against the Discipline by presiding over same gender weddings. The penalties for doing so include a year's suspension without pay for the first infraction and being "defrocked" for a second one. That policy goes into place on January 1, 2020. Other than that, there are no other major changes, and no votes that will take place on any issues until the next General Conference, which takes place in May of 2020. There has been conversation around our church about "voting in January." That information is incorrect. No votes will be taken in January. The next votes will come in May at General Conference by the delegates present. If the denomination ends up splitting, somewhere down the road, each Annual Conference and church will have to vote about where they want to be – but that action will be a while in coming. So, in the meantime, nothing has changed in the church as a whole or in Elkton UMC.

December Birthdays


