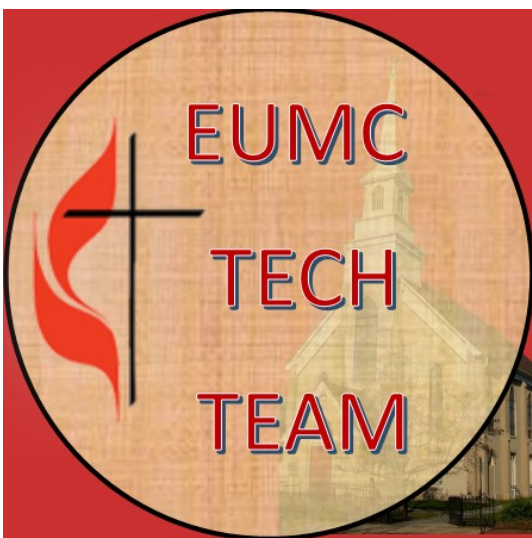
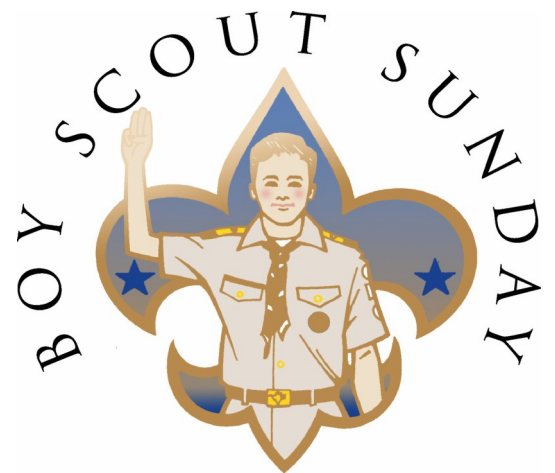

Finance News

The financial position of EUMC for the year 2018 is negative (\$10,823.69). Even though we ended the year negative the original budget had projected a deficit of (\$59,524.00). The difference from the budgeted amount and the actual was mainly due to not needing to replace the air conditioning in the sanctuary, which was budgeted for \$35,000.00.

The income came in very close to the budgeted or projected amount, the actual was \$452,174.14 and the budgeted amount was \$452,591.00. This is only a shortfall of \$416.86. The expenses were budgeted at \$512,475.00, the actual was \$462,997.83. This is a savings of \$49,477.17.

As stated above the biggest part of the savings was not needing to replace the air conditioning in the sanctuary.

The expenses total year-to-date is \$426,523, which consists of the following:

- The expense savings verses budget is as follows:
- 1.) General Expenses \$4,921.33
 - 2.) Church Staff \$1,603.18
 - 3.) Council on Ministries \$2,971.90
 - 4.) Education \$4,315.74
 - 5.) Youth Programs \$3,280.38
 - 6.) Rental Property \$120.50
 - 7.) Church Utilities \$666.39
 - 8.) Insurance \$242.77
 - 9.) Church Maintenance \$30,775.37
 - 10.) Parsonage Expenses \$121.53
 - 11.) Miscellaneous \$458.08

This is all due to conservative spending on everyone's part, which is truly appreciated.

In September the Building Fund paid off the loans for the Wesley Wing. Currently the Building Fund has a balance of \$18,425.82. In December the 109 Locust Lane property was sold. The funds from the sale of the property according to the discipline will be set aside for capital improvements to the church.

Besides what the Missions Fund distributes annually the congregation was generous to give \$12,269.00 to One Great Hour of Sharing, \$6,157.00 to UMCOR for Disaster Relief and \$1,403.00 to the USO.

Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes Thank You

First, Thank You to Pastor Karen for repeatedly encouraging so many people to join us in this worthwhile project. 2018 was a milestone year, 25 years ago the first Shoebox Gifts were delivered! The aim has always been to tell children around the world the true meaning of Christmas! Each box is an opportunity for a boy or girl to experience the love of God in a tangible way and, in areas where it can be done safely, many also participate in a Bible Study – "The Greatest Journey".

Since 2010, 11 million children have done this study. For EUMC, it was 2007 when Pastor Karen approved opening this program to our entire church, since then our members have delivered 651 Shoeboxes!! In both 2012 & 2013 you delivered 79 shoeboxes and for Christmas 2018, you came close to our high by delivering 65 shoeboxes!!

Thank you so much, EUMC members for helping this church continue to share God's love with these children around the world in 2018!!

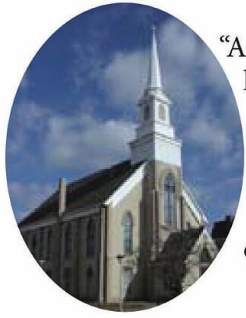
