Dear Friends,

Around 25 years ago, I had the great blessing of visiting the Holy Land. I traveled there with a group of parishioners from the last church I served, and over the course of our trip, we visited many of the historical sites and "walked where Jesus walked." It was a once-in-a-lifetime trip that brought the Bible alive for me. I was especially moved spending time in the Garden of Gethsemane amidst those ancient olive trees, being on a boat on the Sea of Galilee (remembering that Jesus once stilled those waters), and then walking the Via Dolorosa (the way of the cross). That walk reminded me of that painful final journey of Jesus, when he made his way through the crowds carrying the cross on his back. I remember that the Lent and Easter seasons the next year were very profound for me, because of having been in those very places.

That's one of the reasons I think Lent is important for all of us every year. Because it's so easy for us to forget the cost Jesus paid for us. It's so easy for us to spend time looking at lovely parables, and thinking of Jesus caring for children, or talking with his disciples. And all of that is good, but we dare not forget the high price he paid for us.

And that's what we remember this month, this season of Lent. The depth of his love for us, the pain he endured for us, the way he paved for us to eternal life. I pray that you will enter fully into Lent this year – that you will journey with Jesus to the cross, so that, on Easter Day, you can rejoice like never before!


Monthly Men's Breakfast at Cracker Barrel

- ~ Please make sure to sign your children in and leave contact information each week! If there is an emergency, we will need the information.
- ~ If your child is running a fever, has vomited, or had loose bowels in the last 24 hours please keep them with you or at home. We want to limit the spread of germs!
- ~ The nursery is for birth through kindergarten. If your child is in 1st grade or higher, they should be in the service.
- ~ Unless you are the volunteer for that service, please limit your time in the nursery. Having parents stay through parts of the service upsets other children whose parents are in the service. (They think it is time to go if other adults are in the room!)

LENT AT ELKTON UMC

Finance News

The income for January 2019 Ministries (the general operating fund) was \$52,273 and the total expenses for the same period were \$38,320, leaving a balance of \$13,952. The large amount of income for the period was due to several members of the church paying a very large portion of their pledge. Compared to 2018, the expenses for January are down by \$1,113. This savings is due to the change in staff.

Initial Offering

Initial Offering – If you use offering envelopes, you'll notice that the first envelope is marked "Initial Offering." This money goes to cover the cost of the offering envelopes themselves. We suggest an offering of \$5.00.

On-Line Giving

Just a reminder that you can sign up to give your offering on-line any time you wish. The snow day in January when worship was cancelled was a perfect example of how on-line giving is so helpful to the church. Even though we had no worship services, we still brought in nearly \$4000 in income through on-line giving. For the church, those occasions when worship is cancelled are rare, but the effects can be devastating because of loss of income. On-line giving takes much of that worry away. So please consider giving your offering online. It's easy to do. Just go to the church website (elktonumc.org) and click on the link for on-line donations and you'll be walked through the process to sign up. Questions? Call the church office.

Reflections on General Conference 2019:

I bid you grace and peace from the Lord Jesus Christ.

During the Monday night worship service at General Conference this week we read the following version of the Wesley Covenant Prayer:

The church is not ours but Yours, O God.

Use it however You desire, rank it however You inspire.

Activate it, allow it to struggle.

Use it to demonstrate Your glory,

or let it be diminished so that You alone are praised.

Lift it up or bring it low,

whatever is more useful to Your mission of salvation.

Let the church be full, let it be empty.

Let it have it all, let it have nothing.

We freely and heartily yield the church to You

To enjoy what is Yours or to change what is Yours.

Open Your church to the fresh breezes of Your Spirit.

Baptize Your church afresh with the rushing waters of Your Spirit.

Renew, Revive, Renovate, Revitalize Your church,

Blessed God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.

I lead with this as I write to you now that the 2019 Special Session of General Conference has ended. We voted to keep the traditional tenants of our current Book of Discipline that prohibit LGBTQIA+ ordination and church marriage ceremonies. The "Traditional Plan" in its entirety did not pass because it has a number of unconstitutional petitions. The Judicial Council at their April meeting will further refine this. The "One Church Plan" (the more progressive option) did not pass and the margin of the vote was close.

I am deeply aware of the hurt and pain that this has brought upon the LGBTQAI+ community, their families and friends. I regret this pain and suffering and call us to minister grace and healing to this part of our church family. Everyone is of sacred worth and all are indispensable for the up-building of the church.

The mission and ministry of Jesus Christ is still our mission and vision. Nothing can separate us from that love of God. Let us continue this work in the strength of the Spirit.




