

CAN YOU HEAR ME NOW?

YOUTH: You just don't understand how hard it is these days!

ADULT: Hard? I know how hard it gets. I've lived it long before you were around.

Etc., etc., until likely some door is slammed or someone storms out of the room.

The life of teenagers today is not at all like the youth experience of their 40-year-old parents or their 70-year-old grandparents.... OR IS IT? Each generation faces unique challenges that are defined by the cultural expectations of the day, but many of the issues are universal across the years. 

I was born in a small hospital in Merriville, Indiana, not too far from Gary, where we lived. My father was an Army veteran who after the war became a steelworker. This work continued until the economic crash, and he subsequently became a firefighter and private business owner. My mother is a life-long learner, always looking to expand her mind while serving as a nurse, history professor, librarian, and theologian. Soon after my entry into elementary school, we moved from a troubled economically barren Gary, Indiana to be closer to family in Hampton, Virginia. It was in this time and space in my life that I discerned a call to ministry. To be clear, discernment of ones call is not always synonymous with answering that call, but we will get to that in a minute. After discerning my call, I sought out opportunities to exercise my God-



divine nature of my being almost cost me my life.

I discovered college in a very real way. Things didn't get too far out of hand, but at every turn, I wanted to be free of the perceived bondage of my call to ministry. I tried very hard being someone else. My intent was to bury that old life of rules and responsibilities. What I didn't realize was that God had planted in me a seed and

graduating from high school, I set off for college in Greensboro, North Carolina. My location changed, but my call remained constant, and my disobedience to the true

given talents through music and service while I was still a youth. The friends that I made and lessons learned during this time in no small way shaped the man I am today. This fertile ground that we call "church" should be a place of discovery, wonder, and

With all my running, I never imagined that God was running directly toward me! Grace captured me one night as I sat in the Appalachian Mountains. I gave up my spring break that year to serve with a service project. That week was intense! We built a bathroom for a 90+-year-old woman that only had cold running water and an outhouse. I remember the second to last night when I sat in the great room feeling a sense of fullness and completion with the project and the ability to provide a service to someone in need. As I sank into the chair, I was reminded by the spirit that I would be happiest in my life doing the thing that I was created to do. Service in Ministry!

burying it only began the growing process.

FINANCE NEWS

In the month of August, the church opened a money market account with Columbia Bank – now Fulton Bank - that will make 2.06% interest until the end of the year. The money going into this account is from the Building Fund. This will allow the church to make some interest and have ready-access to the money without penalty.

The Ministries Fund has a CD with an originating value of \$58,000.00 earning 2.6% that will mature on January 18, 2021.

The Building Fund, at the end of August, has a balance of \$66,625.20. In addition, there is \$10,000.00 in the Money Market and a CD of \$50,000.00, earning 2.35%, that matures on January 29, 2020. This brings the total of the Building Fund without interest to \$126,625.00 as of August 31, 2019.

It takes many helping hands to keep our church running smoothly. Some of you already know what it's like to serve on one of our committees and some of you don't really know what committees we have and how we – you and me – keep our church thriving via our helping hands and the gift of our time and talents. So, in honor of our upcoming Ministries Fair (formerly called our Stewardship Fair) taking place on Sunday, October 20th, here is an in-depth look at "us" as prepared by the current leaders of the various ministries. Think about where your gifts and talents might be best suited and don't hesitate to answer God's call...

The **EDUCATION COMMITTEE** led by Katie Sparks involves many different areas of education and children's ministry. As a member of the education committee, you help choose the Sunday school curriculum and the structure of the program. You would help plan events for the teachers (such as Teacher Appreciation Sunday and Christian Education Sunday) and monthly events for all the children in the program (such as movie nights, bowling, and ice skating). We also plan and lead annual Sunday school events like the Christmas Pageant, Easter Egg Hunt, and Vacation Bible School. If you can work with kids, decorate, plan, create advertisements, cook, sing, act, dance, or recruit volunteers then come see us because the children we serve would love to have you on board!

The **UNITED METHODIST WOMEN'S BOARD** is led by Judy Tanner and comprises the Dorcas Circle led by Sue Ivey and the Ruth/Sarah Circle led by Ellen Gruebel. The Dorcas Sisters Circle meets monthly on the 2nd Thursday at 6:30 pm. This group gathers to support each other through prayer, fellowship, and spiritual study, as well as the sharing of talents and gifts as they knit, crochet, sew, and do other handiwork. The Ruth/Sarah Circle meets monthly on the 2nd Wednesday at 12 noon and are followed by Bible study. This Circle's purpose is to know God through regular Bible study and discussion during a fellowship meal. These two groups sponsor the Cookie Walk, where volunteers help out as needed.

The STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE currently co-chaired by Ellen and Rich Gruebel is focused on looking after the church and its members to the best of their talents and abilities and to be good stewards of all that God has given us. During the year they are responsible for our Earth Day Celebration in April; our Health Fair featuring vendors who share advice on how to stay healthy in body and mind; 5K Walks/Runs benefitting Dementia (2017) and ALS this year. And they also host the annual Stewardship Fair – now called the Ministries Fair – where you will be able to meet with all EUMC committee representatives who will share information about their committee and instill a desire in you to enlist to help.

The CHURCH AND SOCIETY COMMITTEE provides a platform for members of EUMC to explore issues impacting not only us, but also people throughout the world. We seek to educate our members about the social principles of the United Methodist Church and to create opportunities for discourse that may lead to action. Our goal is to identify topic areas (both areas identified by the General Board of Church and Society and others that are relevant to our local community), educate our members on the stance of the UMC on the specific social issues, provide a safe, open space for dialogue, and encourage members to take action in

whatever way(s) they are comfortable with. This will be accomplished by holding an open meeting every other month for members to dive into a specific topic. The meetings will be held on Sunday afternoons; lunch will be provided. Then a facilitated discussion will take place. We are always seeking new members to join us in reaching our vision and goals as stated above. Committee members determine the topics to be discussed, organize the forums by crafting an agenda, creating content, and facilitating small group discussions during the forum. The COMMUNICATIONS COMMITTEE includes our TECH TEAM and our WEBMASTER. Nancy Crawford chairs the committee and is responsible for making sure all the "vines" of this committee stay connected. We utilize every means possible to "get the word out"— bulletin inserts, fliers, posters, newsletter articles, radio messages, newspaper publicity, Karen's Friday emails, TV banners, our website and our Facebook page, word of mouth, smoke signals — whatever it takes. We also schedule the "Sign the Red Book" videos starring members of the church and we oversee the production of our EUMC photo directory every four years. Our Tech Team oversees installation of electronic equipment, trouble-shooting and maintaining equipment, serving in our Tech booth every Sunday morning to tape our 11:00am service and keeping us current with technology. Also integral to our committee is our webmaster, Jeff Bunnell, who works his magic to keep our website and Facebook pages up to date while also creating the TV banners you see rotating every Sunday, uploading the recorded weekly services so they can be viewed on YouTube, working closely with all committee chairs to communicate their events and making sure we are utilizing social media to serve our needs.

Mike Foster chairs our MISSIONS COMMITTEE. Each year in late fall, congregants present to the church their financial pledge for the coming year. Pledges can be directed to one, or all, of three categories: Building, Administration, and Missions. Many different groups and individuals are supported by our pledges. EUMC also provides contributions for several organizations throughout our Peninsula-Delaware conference such as Red-Bird Missions, Methodist Action Program, Neighborhood House, and Global Ministries. The balance of the other organizations and individuals supported are administered through the Missions committee and the other church committees. Our church members not only contribute their dollars, but also their time and talents serving those in need throughout our local community, our national community, and beyond. In addition to the above regional and national programs, listed below are some of the organizations we support locally: Cecil County Help Center, Cecil County Pregnancy Center, Meeting Ground, Paris Foundation, Christmas in April, Camp Pecometh, Scouts, Deep Roots, Teacher support, Tidewater Gospel Relief, Mission Trips and much more. One of our committee members sums it up this way: "The Missions Committee has opened my eyes to all of the people and organizations our church supports. 
