#### **MISSIONSCOMMITTEE**

Because of the coronavirus, we have seen a reduction in the monetary giving to Missions during this year. We have been able to continue to support almost all of our mission projects. Trying to figure out our finances for 2021 has been a little difficult and we have reviewed our commitments. We think we can support most of our mission projects, but we may have to reduce some of our financial support. We plan to stay on top of this problem and do all we can.

• EUMC monthly blood drives for the Blood Bank of Delmarva:

We have had blood donations in September, October and November and averaged about 25 donors. Our next donation is December 11<sup>th</sup> from noon until 5:00 pm. If you wish to donate, you can sign up at <u>delmarvablood.org</u> or walk-ins are welcome.

Tentative dates for 2021 are: January 8<sup>th</sup>, February 5<sup>th</sup>, March 5<sup>th</sup>, April 9<sup>th</sup>, May 7<sup>th</sup>, June 4<sup>th</sup>, July 2<sup>nd</sup>, August 6<sup>th</sup>, September 3<sup>rd</sup>, October 1<sup>st</sup>, November 5<sup>th</sup>, and December 3<sup>rd</sup>. Donating Blood Saves Lives.

- Operation Christmas Child Shoe Box Donation to provide Christmas giving and joy to children around the world resulted in 35 shoe boxes at EUMC being contributed to support Children and show them Jesus' love at Christmas time.
- Harvest Food Festival for Immaculate Conception resulted in over 160 bags being contributed to provide food and supplies to those in need in the Elkton area.
- All of our mission trips were cancelled for 2020, but hopefully we will be able to resume in 2021
- The Emergency Rotating Shelter will not be as it has been in the past. Meeting Ground is hoping that churches will supply to-go meals during the months of the shelter. More on this will follow.
- UMCOR donations totaled \$11,332.

#### FINANCE NEWS

The year-to-date balance in the Ministries Fund as of October 31, 2020 is a deficit of \$12,121.71. The total income through October 31, 2020 was \$322,665.39 and total expenses were \$334,787.10. In comparison to 2019 at the same time, the deficit was \$20,694.45. Therefore, even though 2020 has been an incredibly difficult year, the church is holding its own. This is due to the savings in staff salaries, church maintenance and being conservative in the overall spending.

You may remember the church applied for and received a PPP Loan from the government, which was handled through Fulton bank. The amount of the loan was \$27,891.85 and this amount was placed into a Notes Payable account, which allowed the church to have use of the cash but not consider it income. The church received notification from the bank that the loan has been forgiven. So, in the month of November, the Notes Payable will be canceled out of the accounting and the income will increase. This will have direct effect on the bottom line.

Below you will see a comparison of the income and expenses for 2020 verses 2019.

Without the dedication of the members of this very generous church, we would not be in the position we are currently. Thank you for your continued generosity.

Please remember to pick them up in person, because that saves the church the expense of mailing them. You can pick them up on Sunday either before or after the worship service, during office hours (Monday through Friday from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm), or they will be available for pickup with the Communion elements on Thursday, December 3<sup>rd</sup> through Saturday, December 5<sup>th</sup>.



#### **ONLINE GIVING**

Did you know that you can give your offering online? This method of giving has all sorts of benefits for you and the church. It's probably safe to say that you already do a lot of your bill paying that way, and that you probably rarely write a check anymore. So giving online to the church would come naturally for you. The benefits for the church are incredible! Online givers provide a steady stream of income throughout the year because when givers are on vacation or absent for other reasons, or on the rare occasion when services are cancelled because of severe weather, the money still comes in. And that is a great benefit to the ongoing ministry of the church. 
