• EUMC monthly blood drives for the Blood Bank of Delmarva: Our April blood drive had 35 donors, which is higher than our average has been. While the number of donors is very good, the number of EUMC donors is not nearly the majority and in fact we do not have many EUMC donors. Our next donation is May 7th from 12:00 pm until 5:00 pm. Sunday, April 18th through May 9th

SERIES OVERVIEW: You know that feeling you get when someone makes you a big promise? You probably feel excited, but you might feel a little skeptical too — especially when that promise gets delayed . . . and delayed again . . . and again. If you have to wait long enough for something you were promised, you might start to wonder when you've waited long enough. Eventually, you might even give up hope. In this 4-week series, we'll meet a handful of people from Scripture who each spent a long time waiting on God. From the stories of Abraham and Sarah, Paul and Silas, King David, and Joseph, we'll discover that God has a plan, but we might have to wait for it, and we'll be reminded that, while we're waiting, God is faithful, God is listening, and we should never give up, because God's not giving up on us.

IMPORTANT DATES IN CHURCH HISTORY

Council of Nicea - Part 1

Almost 300 years passed since the Church began. By this time, Christianity had spread to Europe, Africa and Asia. The Roman Empire still dominated the known world, but Christians were being violently persecuted by the Jews, mobs, kings, rulers, and emperors. Thousands and thousands of Christians of all ranks were murdered for their faith in Jesus Christ.

But this all changed when "a brighter prospect was opened to the Christian world." The year was 323 A.D. when the Emperor Constantine defeated the tyrant Licinius and tranquility was established for the church. Constantine enacted laws to protect and strengthen the church by recalling those who had been banished for profession of the faith; restored property and goods of those banished. He also decreed that old churches would be restored and new and more splendid ones built. The Emperor commanded that the clergy should be held in honor and protected from foreign enemies. The people were exhorted to give up idolatry and embrace the true Christian religion. It became the religion of the Roman Empire.

Now, while Constantine was zealously overseeing this great work, a dissension arose in the very heart of the Christian world that began to cause such division and animosity that it got the attention of Emperor Constantine.

The dispute started in Alexandria, Egypt between Bishop Alexander and one of his presbyters by the name of Arius over the nature of the Holy Trinity.


