FROM THE PASTOR

Revelations 21:3 – See, the home of God is among mortals. He will dwell with them; they will be his peoples, and God himself will be with them.

I'm always amazed how life springs forth so quickly from the cold, barren, winter season. Life seems to always prevail. I notice this too whenever I'm spending some time in nature out at Fair Hill. There are numerous ruins from old farms around, but in just a short time nature has already reclaimed much of it. Even from the old windowsills of the collapsing homes, plants grow and thrive as they burst out of the stonework. Dead trees that have fallen are home to mushrooms, insects, and other lifeforms as they make use of the dead wood. Daffodils are the first to emerge as they cover the hillsides that used to be brown.

Easter is the season that proclaims the good news that life wins out over death. When we celebrate the resurrection of our savior Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday, we are also celebrating our own resurrection. We know that just like the Fair Hill ruins, our bodies may fall apart on us. However, the promise is that on the day of our death we will be with Christ in paradise and that in the glorious age of Christ's return, we will experience a bodily resurrection. There will be a new heaven and new earth for our new bodies, and we will dwell in the presence of the Lord forever.

We need to proclaim the good news that life prevails, especially when we are inundated with scenes of death and destruction from the terrible war in Ukraine. When evil looks like it is winning, when death seems to claim another victory, we as the church proclaim, "*Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting? But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ (1 Cor. 15:55, 57).*" May we claim Easter as our victory season this year and every year to come.

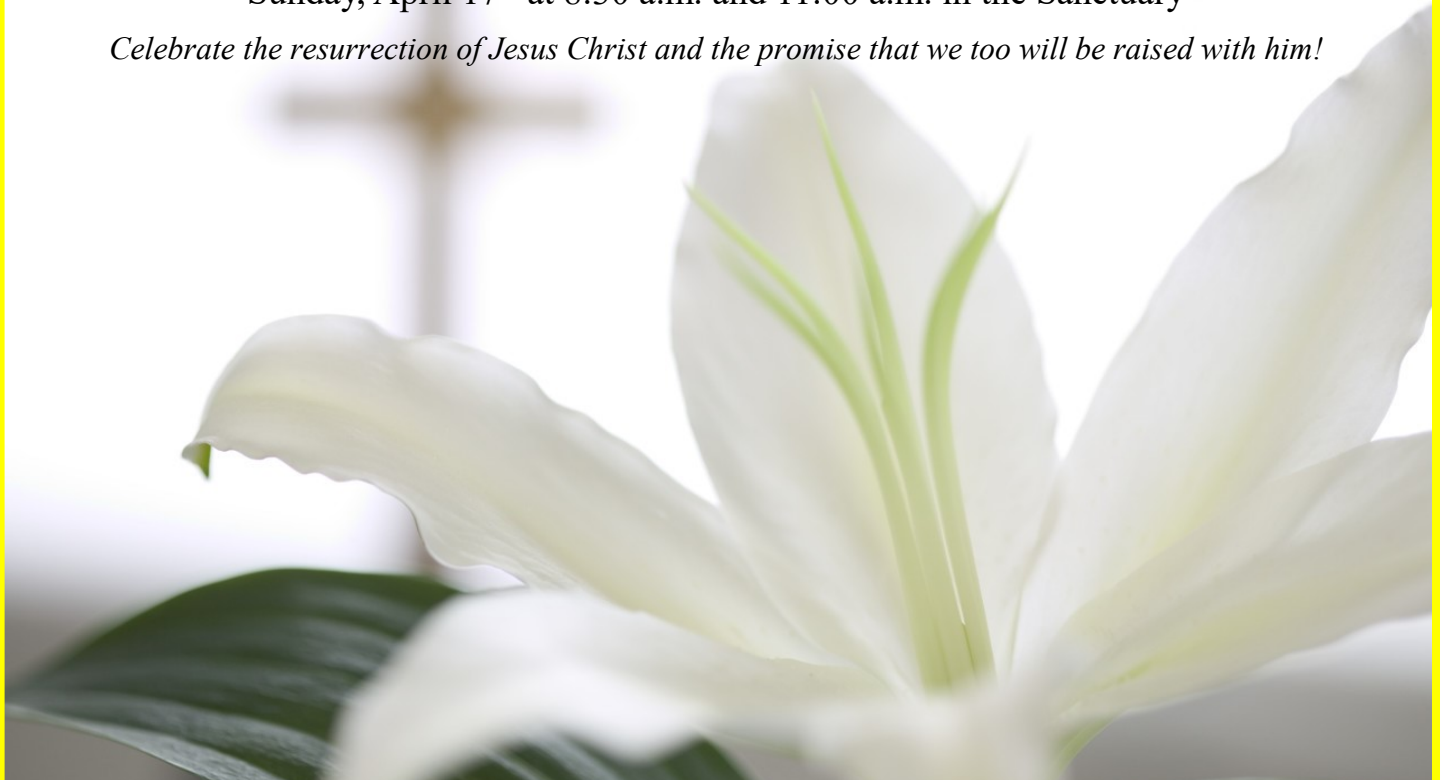

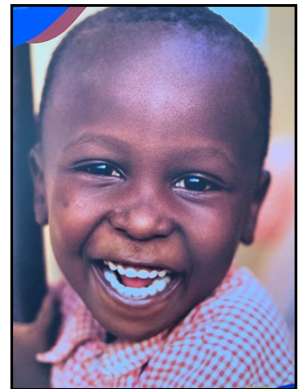

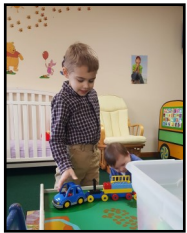

FINANCE NEWS

At the end of February, the church had been blessed to be in the black by \$18,597.31, which, when compared to the same time last year, is up 36%. What a wonderful position to be in so early in the fiscal year. The expenses so far this year are down by \$4,471.16. And, as you can see, the income is up by \$11,152.15.

In the February Finance meeting, the committee decided to sell the stock that is part of Ministries. The net value of the three stocks the church had was \$96,492.29. This amount will be brought up to an even \$100,000.00 for a second money market account. At present, we have an existing money market account that is made up of the Ministries Fund, Mission Fund and Building Fund. The existing money market will be revised and used only for the Mission and Building Funds. The new money market account will be used for Ministries. This will allow the church to make some interest on the money and also transfer funds online when needed to the appropriate funds.

Without your continued generous contributions EUMC would not be in this positive financial situation. You, the congregation, have been very steady with your constant support throughout these very challenging time and for that we are very blessed.

CHRISTIAN VOICES FROM THE PAST

Katherine von Bora 1499-1552

Part Two

On June 13, 1525, Dr. Martin Luther and Katherine von Bora were married in a private ceremony at the Black Cloister, the converted monastery where Luther lived. And although Luther had many friends and followers who wished them well, he was still not without enemies. Slandorous reports about the newlyweds circulated about, even one to go so far as to state their first-born child would be the Antichrist!

Some doubted, Luther, now forty-two and Katherine, twenty-five, that their marriage would succeed. However, the reverse proved to be true, as history records, for their marriage not only succeeded, “but set a high standard for Christian family life for centuries to come.”

It wasn't easy for Katherine to convert a rundown cloister into a comfortable home. Nor was it easy to convert a hyperactive professor-preacher into a patient husband and father. It is said she always called him Doctor Luther, but Luther had a number of pet names for his Katherine besides “Kitty, my rib.” He also called her “Selbänder,” which is German for “better half.” It was not unusual for him to refer to her as “my Lord Kate” or “Doctor Katherine (she was an excellent nurse and dispenser of herbal medicines). On occasions when Luther felt she was giving too many orders, he quietly called her “Kette,” the German word for “chain.”

Not only did Katherine transform the old cloister into a comfortable home for them and their children, but she made it a welcoming place of gathering for Luther's students and family relatives. One can imagine the crowd of people around Katherine's table as Luther taught and debated, and his food got cold, to the annoyance of Katherine. But out of these mealtime conversations came one of Luther's finest books, *The Table Talk of Martin Luther*, thanks to Katherine recording his words.

One can only marvel at her energetic management of their home. She kept cows for milk and butter and produced a cheese so good that it was said to be better than anything in the town. She started a piggery because Luther liked pork. And he was so happy about this that he affectionately added another name for her - “My Lord Kate, Mistress of the pigsty.” She turned a neglected field into a productive garden and even planted an orchard. This was followed by stocking a pond with fish.

As in every home, there were times of trial and sorrow. Of their six children, three boys and three girls, two of the girls died during childhood. At six each morning, Martin and Katherine would pray with the children, and they would recite the Ten Commandments, the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and end with the singing of a psalm before family chores and Luther's busy day of preaching and lecturing at the university.

Luther was not a robust man, often sick and nursed back to health by Katherine. He died in 1546 with Katherine and his children at his bedside.

After Luther's death, war broke out and Katherine and the children had to flee Wittenberg. Years later they returned only to find their home and fields ruined and all their cattle gone! But the plague returned and they had to flee again. During this trip, Katherine was thrown from the wagon into the icy waters of a ditch and became gravely ill. Her daughter, Margaret, nursed her tenderly but there was to be no recovery. Katherine von Bora died on December 20, 1552, at Torgau, Germany, where she is buried in St. Mary's Church.

On her monument was written "There fell asleep in God here at Torgau the late blessed Dr. Martin Luther's widow Katherine von Bora."

Let me conclude these words with a story about Katherine. At a time during their marriage, Luther had grown extremely worried and stress-out and apparently this had gone on for quite a while. Instead of being his usual jolly and smiling self, he was downcast over all the battles he was fighting! One day Katherine met him at the door wearing a black mourning dress. "Who died?" Luther asked. "God," said Katherine. "You foolish thing!" said Luther. "Why this foolishness? It is true," she persisted. "God must have died, or Doctor Luther would not be so sorrowful."

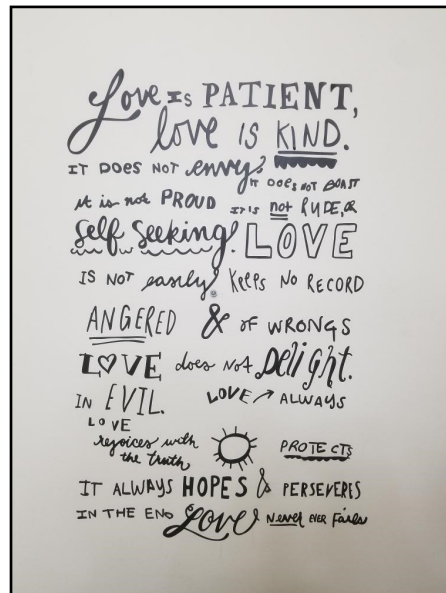

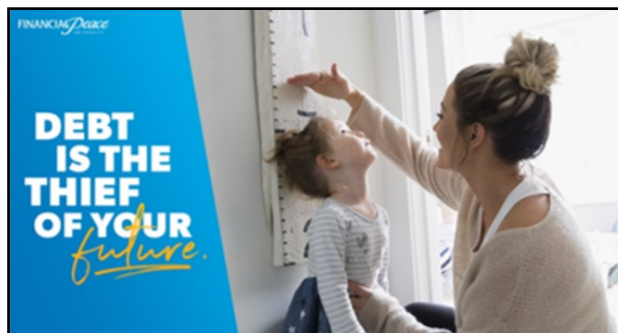

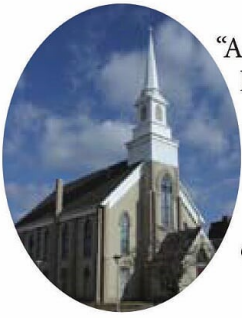
