1 Peter 2:23-25 - When he was abused, he did not return abuse; when he suffered, he did not threaten; but he entrusted himself to the one who judges justly. He himself bore our sins in his body on the cross, so that, free from sins, we might live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed. For you were going astray like sheep, but now you have returned to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

#### Christ's Love Endured

When I was in college, I was doing an internship in Michigan and the pastor invited me to come with him to do some visitations. It was one of my first experiences doing pastoral visitation and we were going to visit with a 92-year-old woman was in the hospital after she had fallen and broken her hip. While we were there, her husband of 72 years appeared in the door, moved to her bedside, and lovingly kissed her. He cupped her hands and spoke words of love to her. He sat beside her and stroked her arm. I was made witness to their love that had surely endured through many difficult days and ups and downs in their 72 years together.

And to think that their love is a pale reflection of the love Christ has for us, which also endures. Ephesians 3:10 says that Christ's love surpasses all knowledge. God's love has persisted throughout human history even after Adam and Eve sinned in the garden; even after the Israelites forsook their covenant with God in the Promised Land; even after Jesus suffered and died at the very hands of God's beloved creation. But Romans 8:38 says that nothing can separate us from the love of God.

Do we allow our love for others to endure even when they have failed us, betrayed us, mocked us, harmed us, or abandoned us? Christ experienced all such sufferings. Abandoned by his disciples, mocked by the soldiers, betrayed by the people of Jerusalem, harmed by his torturers and executors. Yet one of the last things he said while alive, dying on the cross was, "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do." May Jesus's words be our words for one another and all the people of this world.




### THE SEASON OF LENT

It is a somber, yet holy season during which we remember the tremendous and painful price Jesus paid for us and for our salvation.

The end of 2021 closed on a very good note for Ministries, **ending in the black by \$22,179.53**. This is due largely, but not only, to your continued generous support, as well as staffing changes and being very conservative with spending. You may remember that EUMC ended 2020 in the black also, but that was helped by the PPP loan that was received and forgiven. As you can see below, 2020 ended in the black by \$29,203.45; the PPP loan amount was \$27,891.85, which means that actually the real gain amount was \$1,311.60.

#### CHRISTIAN VOICES FROM THE PAST

#### George Whitefield 1714-1770

Biographer Arnold A. Dallimore wrote: "God's accomplishments through George Whitefield are to this day virtually unparalleled. In an era when many ministers were timid and apologetic in their preaching, he preached the gospel with zeal and undaunted courage. In the wake of his fearless preaching, revival swept across the British Isles, and the Great Awakening transformed the American colonies."

Called by many the greatest preacher that England ever produced, George Whitefield was born in Gloucester, England on December 16, 1714 to parents who ran the Bell Inn.

Growing up, young George had a good memory and a glib tongue that helped him excel at making speeches and acting in plays at school. Despite health issues, which plagued him all of his life, George entered Oxford University where he met John and Charles Wesley and became part of their Holy Club Meetings. At twenty-two, this boy wonder of London was drawing great crowds who came to hear him preach the gospel and hundreds were converted to faith in Christ. Over the course of his life, his preaching shook Great Britain and America, resulting in the Great Awakening. In fear of popularity and promotion, this humble man of God prayed, "Heavenly Father, for Thy dear Son's sake, keep me from climbing."

George Whitefield preached from forty to sixty hours a week, which totaled over 18,000 sermons during his 34 years of public ministry. He went out to the people and started open air or field preaching, which was a hallmark of the Methodist movement. Wiersbe wrote: "It comes as a surprise to many people to learn that it was George Whitefield, not John and Charles Wesley, who founded the Methodist Church. The Wesleys entered into Whitefield's labors and eventually were given the leadership of the new movement by Whitefield." This ordained priest of the Church of England died on September 30, 1770, during his seventh visit to America, preaching in New England to the Presbyterians at Newburyport, Massachusetts, where he is buried.

#### **MEETING GROUND NEWS**

Thank you for your support of the Meeting Ground, our mission partners working to help house those in our community who are experiencing homelessness. You may well know about their day use facility, Wayfarers' House and the Men's Shelter, but there is another very exciting program to tell you about. Since September 2021, they have helped 15 individuals and family units obtain permanent housing. With grant funding support, these 15 households are now in rental homes and apartments in town. As the recipients are able to meet financial targets, the support funds are reduced, allowing the tend



are able to meet financial targets, the support funds are reduced, allowing the tenants to become independent and self-supporting.

Meeting Ground still has an immediate need for meals for clients in the winter emergency shelter program. Individuals or groups of friends can provide 25 or 50 meals to feed the clients. In the Sign Up Genius link below you will see MANY open dates. You can deliver bulk food to the Mary Randall Center by 3:30 on your agreed date.

The staff at the Center often step up to provide meals when there is an open date on the calendar, so cash donations are also appreciated. Our mission committee recently provided funds to support up to 5 nights of meals.
